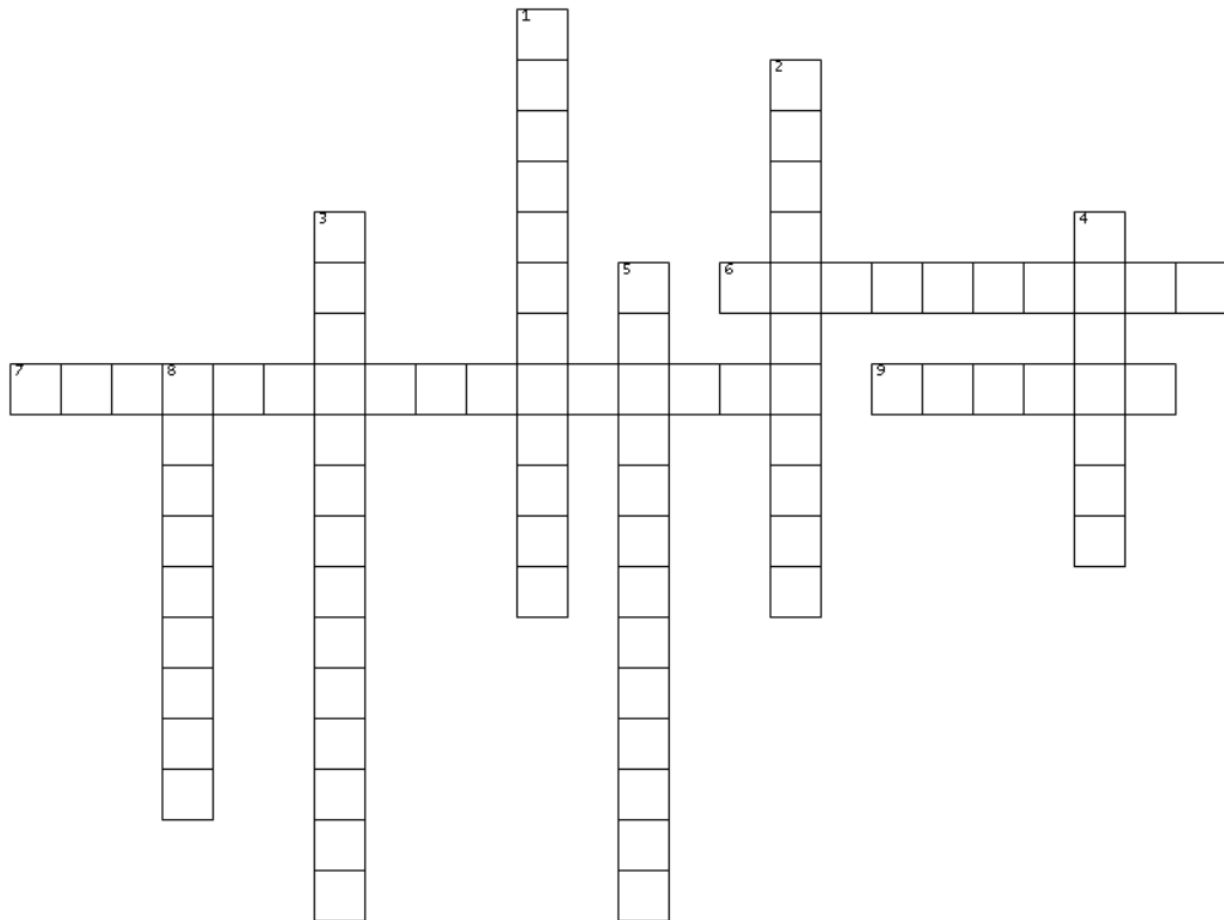


Lesson 4: First Amendment Crossword Puzzle

1. This clause of the First Amendment protects every citizen's right to religious belief and practice without government interference.

3. This word describes acts that are protected by the founding documents of 1787 and 1791.
4. This describes something that is not religious.
5. This clause of the First Amendment forbids the federal government from instituting a national religion.
8. These guidelines were created by the Supreme Court in 1971 to determine whether the establishment clause was violated.
